

## **CBC Soccer Weekly**

The upcoming week will see the Cadets in action 3 times as they travel to DeSmet on Tuesday for a 4:00 encounter and at the end of the week journey to Jeff City for the 2 game Shootout with games vs the host team on Friday and Rockhurst on Saturday.

The DeSmet game is an MCC Conference game and it will be a difficult game as DeSmet always is a better team as the season progresses.
